MARCH MISSION EMPHASIS: UMCOR

The United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) is present in times of crisis and disaster around the world, acting as the hands of Christ in the most difficult or tragic times. This organization is able to provide fast and meaningful relief in the aftermath of disasters thanks in large part to the UMCOR Sunday Offering collected by local congregations every year. When our congregation contributes to this offering, we help pay for the general operating costs of UMCOR. Because of this offering, UMCOR is able to direct 100% of other donations directly to specific disaster relief. Your donations, marked "UMCOR," may be left at the communion rail or placed in the offering plate today or any Sunday in March. You may also send them to or bring them by the church office.



The butterfly has long been a symbol of resurrection and hope, for it disappears into a cocoon and appears dead, but emerges later far more beautiful and powerful than before. The butterfly symbolizes not just Christ's resurrection from the dead, but the hope of every Christian for resurrection and transformation. During Lent, you will find paper butterflies available in the sanctuary on which you can write a prayer expressing your yearning and hope for new life for yourself, for others, for our world. These prayer butterflies will be placed in a "cocoon" during the season of Lent to symbolize that we are saved "in hope" (see Romans 8:22-24). What we hope and pray for cannot yet be seen, but lies hidden. Nevertheless. God is at work in the unseen and hidden moments, the Lenten wilderness times of life, even when we feel that God is absent from us. On Easter Sunday the butterflies will emerge from the cocoon, taking flight in a beautiful display celebrating the glory of Easter and claiming the promise that God will fulfill our prayers in ways we cannot even imagineways that "God alone can see."

FAITH IN ACTION

THE GIFT OF LIFE By Lydia Clay



More than 120,000 people are waiting for organ transplants; approximately 30,000 are done every year. With average wait times of five to six years, thousands of people die each year waiting for the gift of life.

My father was one of the thousands who ran out of time. He passed away in 2008 waiting for a liver transplant. Knowing these crushing statistics, and the devastation of losing a loved one, I felt called to act when I learned my Leadership Austin classmate, Émily, had an 18-month-old son waiting for a kidney transplant. Barrett, or Bear as he's better known, was born without working kidneys. At only two days old, he started daily dialysis to keep him alive.

After months of testing, and beyond everyone's belief, I was a strong match for a living donation. Without any blood relation the transplant team ranked me a 10 out of 10 donor for Bear, a rating they rarely give. On November 17, 2016, Bear and I entered side-by-side operating rooms. The long painful surgery and subsequent recovery was a success.

I am blessed and humbled to have given this gift to Bear. It has changed me a person and reaffirmed my faith. Holding him now reminds me how intertwined our lives are and how bold acts of faith create space for miracles to happen. Thank you to my FUMC family for the prayers, love and support during this amazing journey.
