JUNE EMPHASIS:

Peace with Justice Offering Moved by Christ's love to pursue reconciliation and peace, honoring the dignity of every individual made in God's image, the United Methodist Church is unwilling to turn a blind eye to injustice.

Because of the Peace with Justice Offering, the people of The United Methodist Church are able to make a difference together by sowing seeds—and yielding fruit!—of peace. Half of the offering will support Peace with Justice Grants beyond our local church, at the Conference and Global level of the UMC. The other half will go to support the peace and justice work of Austin Region of Justice for Our Neighbors (ARJFON), a United Methodist-affiliated immigration ministry that provides free or low-cost legal advice and services.

Monetary donations may be left at our communion rail or sent to or brought by the church office during the month of June.

JUNE AND JULY: Toiletry Collection

Traveling this summer? Pack up those unused toiletry items and donate them for our neighbors experiencing homelessness. FAITH IN ACTION

GLIMPSING THE CHURCH UNIVERSAL By Sandy Wilder



I still clearly remember my first time: At Travis Park UMC in San Antonio, pastors and lay people streaming in and out of the sanctuary for business sessions and worship...and me, standing in the hallway shaking an empty coffee can. Along with fellow members of the then-Conference Council on Youth Ministry, I was raising funds at Annual Conference to go on a summer youth work team to Bolivia. (We succeeded, by the way.)

Since then attending Annual Conference has come to mean so much more to me: hearing world-class preaching, standing in support of friends being ordained, voting on administrative and ministry matters, cruising the exhibit hall and bookstore aisles, celebrating friends retiring, discussing church business with people whose views are different from mine, sharing meals, forming friendships, and catching a glimpse of the Church Universal – or at least the United Methodist version of it.

A system of regular conferences of lay preachers to conduct the business of the Methodist movement in the colonies was inaugurated in the late 1700s. Today, these annual (regional) gatherings are still held to conduct business and strengthen fellowship in every part of the world where there are Methodists. I am honored to serve First Church and the ongoing Methodist movement by attending Annual Conference.
