Dear Church Family,

Please join me on a journey to define “Who We Are” as a church through a series of “Listening Sessions” held in church members homes and at the church. A Listening Session is an interactive conversation that will explore who we are as a church and who God has called us to be. These Listening Sessions will form the first step in a process of re-imagining our Church’s mission, vision, and core values—the key words we use to give shape to our identity as a church. First Church is deeply rooted, with a long history of ministry in Downtown Austin. It’s healthy for a church to step back periodically to ask, “Why has God put us here?” and “Who are we becoming, by God’s grace?” run through the beginning of November. How will you use our feedback?

Throughout the course of twenty-one Listening Sessions, scribes will be assigned to listen, observe, and record key insights and consistencies. These insights will get consolidated and reviewed to help FUMC develop its mission, vision, and core values. Once developed, the new messaging will be shared broadly with the congregation and then to the Administrative Board for consideration.

We have done processes like this before.

Why are we doing this again?

The church has continued to grow and change over the last several years. FUMC has engaged in similar processes around 2005-2006 and 2011. This process is healthy to go back and ask these questions again every few years and particularly helpful following a pastoral transition.

Do I need to register for the Listening Sessions?
