It is right to give our thanks and praise.

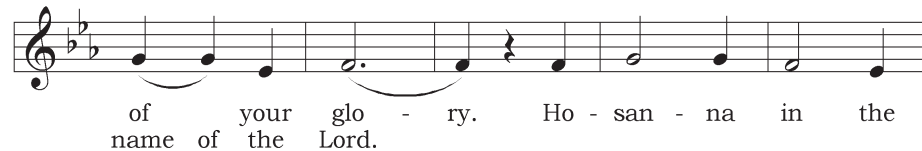
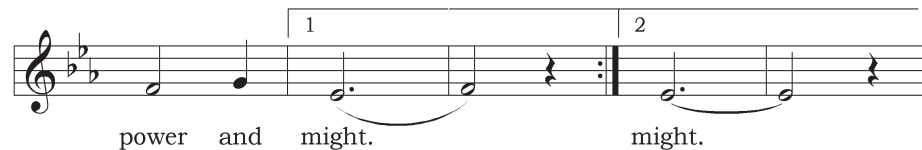
It is right, and a good and joyful thing,

your love remained steadfast.

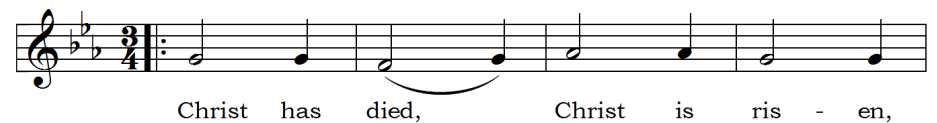
You delivered us from captivity,
