THE GREAT THANKSGIVING



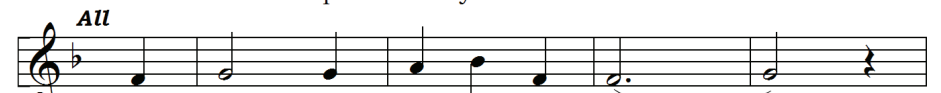

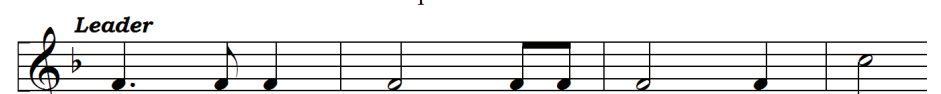
