acknowledging our mortality.**

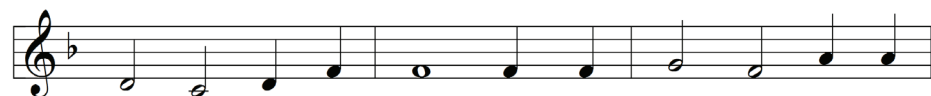

SERMON

INVITATION TO LENTEN DISCIPLINES

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ:
the early Christians observed with great devotion
the days of our Lord's passion and resurrection,
and it became the custom of the Church
that before the Easter celebration
there should be a forty-day season of spiritual preparation.

During this season,
converts to the faith were prepared for Holy Baptism.

It was also a time when persons
who had committed serious sins
and had separated themselves from the community of faith
were reconciled by penitence and forgiveness,
and restored to participation in the life of the Church.

In this way, the whole congregation was reminded
of the mercy and forgiveness proclaimed
in the gospel of Jesus Christ
and the need we all have to renew our faith.

I invite you, therefore, in the name of the Church,
to observe a holy Lent:
by self-examination and repentance;
by prayer, fasting, and self-denial;
and by reading and meditating on God's Holy Word.
To make a right beginning of repentance,
and as a mark of our mortal nature,
we confess our sin.

PRAYER OF CONFESSION

The sacrifice acceptable to God is a broken spirit;
a broken heart – one filled with regret and remorse –
God will not despise.

We are a broken people.
Trusting in God's mending ways,
let us confess our sins before God and one another:

Merciful God,

forgive us.
